Defines Government Records as:

- Printed Documents
- Handwritten Documents
- Books, Maps and Photographs
- Tape and Video Recordings
- Computer Records
- Electronically Stored Information



EXCEPTIONS

- Where a record does not exist and one must be created to respond to a request.
- Information that would jeopardize security.



What Should Be On The Municipal Web Site?

OPRA Logo link to:

- Information about public records
- How the public requests information
- Schedule of fees
- Request Form (paper vs. electronic form)
- Denial and Appeal Process
- Links to State of NJ Opra Web Site
- Names and locations of records custodians and sub-custodians.



What parts of the Web Site need to be considered?

- E-Mail The contents decide.
- Cookies No for Cookies, but Yes for Reports
- Web Pages Yes, if part of an official site
- CGI/Perl or other programs No, security issue
- Databases not the database itself but content may be
